Product Overview

2 1 Function Introduction

This unmanaged switch requires no configuration and can perform data transmission once cable connection is completed. It supports three operating modes: Default, Extend, and VLAN, which can be set through a DIP switch. See the product appearance diagram for the DIP switch. Operating modes:

- Default mode: When enabled, all ports can communicate with each other.
- Extend mode: When enabled, the data transmission speed of PoE ports is limited to 10Mbps, and the PoE ports are isolated from each other and only able to communicate with uplink ports.
- VLAN mode: When enabled, the PoE ports are isolated from each other and only able to communicate with uplink ports. This mode can reduce broadcast storms.




- 4-port and 8-port PoE switches only support the default mode and extend mode. 16-port and 24-port PoE switches support the above three modes.
- The operating mode is set to Default by default. If there is no special requirement, please do not change it. To change the operating mode, disconnect power, toggle the DIP switch to the desired mode, and then restart the device.




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



		Blinking: The port is transmitting data.
PoE-MAX Green		Off: The total PoE power is less than 80% of the total power of the device.
		Steady on: The total PoE power is higher than 85% of the total power of the device.

3 Installation

3.1 Operating Environment Requirements

- Install the device in a place with lightning protection measures.
- Allow enough space (more than 10cm) around the vents of the device for heat dissipation.
- The cabinet or workbench has a good ventilation system.
- The cabinet or workbench is firm enough to hold the weight of the device and mount accessories.
- · The cabinet or workbench is properly grounded.

3.3 Safety Instructions


- Before cleaning, be sure to disconnect the power plug. Do not wipe the device with a wet cloth
 or apply liquid to the device.
- Make sure the operating environment of the device is clean. The dust around the device can be absorbed by static electricity, which may affect the lifetime of the device and result in communication failure.
- Keep the device from water or moisture. Do not let liquid of any kind or moisture enter the device.

- Do not stack devices. It may cause poor ventilation.
- Make sure the operating voltage meets the requirements indicated on the device.
- Do not disassemble the device yourself.

3.4 Device Installation


3.4.1 Place the Device on a Workbench

- 1. Place the device with the bottom up on a large and stable workbench.
- Remove the adhesive backed papers from the rubber feet and attach the rubber feet to the recessed areas on the bottom of the device.
- 3. Turn the device over and place it on the workbench.



3.4.2 Mount the Device on a Wall

- Install two screws (user-supplied) on the wall according to the mounting holes on the bottom of the device.
- Align the mounting holes of the device with the screws on the wall, and then hang the device on the screws.




3.4.3 Mount the Device in a Rack

- 1. Verify that the rack is stable and reliably grounded.
- 2. Secure the mounting brackets to both sides of the device with supplied screws.



Choose an appropriate location and secure the brackets to the rack with screws (usersupplied).



NOTE!

- The screws used in step 3 need to be purchased separately.
- 16-port and 24-port models support workbench mount and rack mount. 4-port and 8-port models support workbench mount and wall mount.

4 Connect Cables

4.1 Connect the Power Cable

Before connecting, ensure that the device is reliably grounded. Follow the steps to connect the power cable:

- 1. Make sure the power supply meets the requirements indicated on the device.
- Connect one end of the power cable to the power connector of the device, and the other end to the AC power outlet.
- Check if the power indicator is on. When the power indicator is on, it indicates that the power supply is connected correctly.

4.2 Connect a Network Cable

Connect one end of a network cable to one of the Ethernet ports of the device, and the other end to a computer or other network devices.

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Network Security

- Minimum port mapping: Configure your router or firewall to open a minimum set of ports to the WAN and keep only the necessary port mappings. Never set the device as the DMZ host or configure a full cone NAT.
- Disable the automatic login and save password features: If multiple users have access to your computer, it is recommended that you disable these features to prevent unauthorized access.
- Choose username and password discretely: Avoid using the username and password of your social media, bank, email account, etc, as the username and password of your device, in case your social media, bank and email account information is leaked.
- Restrict user permissions: If more than one user needs access to your system, make sure each user
 is granted only the necessary permissions.
- Disable UPnP: When UPnP is enabled, the router will automatically map internal ports, and the system will automatically forward port data, which results in the risks of data leakage. Therefore, it is recommended to disable UPnP if HTTP and TCP port mapping have been enabled manually on your router.
- Multicast: Multicast is intended to transmit video to multiple devices. If you do not use this function, it is recommended you disable multicast on your network.
- Check logs: Check your device logs regularly to detect unauthorized access or abnormal operations.
- Isolate video surveillance network: Isolating your video surveillance network with other service networks helps prevent unauthorized access to devices in your security system from other service networks.
- Physical protection: Keep the device in a locked room or cabinet to prevent unauthorized physical access.
- SNMP: Disable SNMP if you do not use it. If you do use it, then SNMPv3 is recommended.
